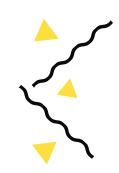

EVERY DAY COUNTS

Attendance Update

Going to school is usually an exciting and enjoyable event for students. However most children are occasionally reluctant to go to school or have some concerns about certain activities. This is very normal and is likely to happen at some stage in their schooling life. As parents/guardians there are many strategies you can use to support them including the following suggestions from the Department of Education:

- Remain calm: you will be better placed to make them feel more confident. Try not to let your child see that you are worried or frustrated
- Listen to your child: encourage him/her to share their feelings
- Don't dismiss your child's feelings: everyone feels afraid sometimes and your child might perceive this as you not understanding or not caring about their concerns
- Talk it through: discuss various scenarios, possible outcomes and ways to handle situations to help your child develop problem solving strategies
- Be punctual: avoid being late when dropping off your child
- Encourage and reassure: encourage your child to go to school; reassure them that you will contact the school to explain
- See the GP: arrange for a visit to the GP if your child reports persistent physical complaints
- Be consistent: have a clear agreement between parents (even if separated) that school attendance is not optional and communicate this in a clear and calm manner to your child
- Seek assistance: there is assistance and support available. The sooner you talk to your child's school about concerns, the better
- Get support: if you need support for yourself if things are feeling overwhelming, Parentline is available 1300 30 1300 (8am to 10pm seven days a week) and web counselling Tuesdays and Thursdays between 11am and 2pm

Funding Reviews

When PSD funded students have short-term funding or are transitioning from Year 6 to Year 7, they will require a review to completed. We have a number of students that fall into these categories this year. Our Leading Teacher completing these applications has started this process and has been/will be in contact with families.

MHiPS (Mental Health in Primary Schools)

Each week students participate in structured Wellbeing lessons that align with the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) resource, a Department resource that is designed to develop students' social, emotional and positive relationship skills.

As well as teaching academic skills, schools provide opportunities for students to develop resilience, promote wellbeing, and cultivate positive social attitudes.

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process through which children and young people build and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes and skills necessary to:

- Understand and manage emotions
- Set and achieve positive goals
- Feel and express empathy
- Establish and maintain positive relationships
- Make responsible decisions
- Develop resilience to deal with change
- Create positive identity
- Contribute to social cohesion

Student Managers and classroom teachers plan lessons following a Wellbeing Scope and Sequence. In Term 2, students will be participating in age-appropriate activities focusing on Problem Solving and Positive Coping.

We have had a busy start to Term 2 in all year groups!

Foundation

In Foundation, we have been learning about the weather. We have already learnt about the difference between day and night, and we have discussed different types of weather including sunny, windy, rainy, snowy and stormy. We made these lovely cloud pictures to show what cloudy weather is like.



Year 1 and 2

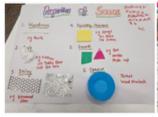
In Year 1 and 2, we have been learning how food changes when it is heated and cooled. We looked at the properties of cooked spaghetti and used a spaghetti poem to create some fun posters! We then looked at uncooked spaghetti and compared how it is different from cooked spaghetti. We tried to make tall towers out of uncooked spaghetti, which was very challenging! Next, we investigated reversible and irreversible changes by looking at melting chocolate and popcorn.



SCIENCE NEWS

Year 3 and 4

In Year 3 and 4, we have been learning about solids and liquids, and completing many fun, hands on activities to share our new learning. We have explored the properties of both and completed some different experiments. We made rock people to explore more about solids, and we used oil and water to learn about liquid density.











Year 5 and 6

In Year 5 and 6, we have been completing a variety of experiments to learn about reversible and irreversible changes. We have been melting butter (reversible), dissolving salt (reversible), evaporation (reversible) and learning about how water changes between the three states of matter.

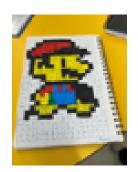

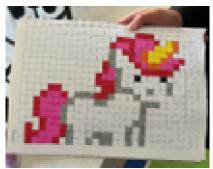

LIBRARY NEWS

During Term 2 at the library, students from all year levels have continued to build on learning valuable strategies in choosing good fit books. These include the five-finger rule and iPick strategies. As we want to continue encouraging a love for reading, strategies such as these help our students choose books that are best suited for them in terms of enjoyment and reading level.

During our library sessions our **Foundation** students are continuing to explore a variety of Eric Carle books which include The Bad Tempered Lady bird and The Mixed-Up Chameleon.

Year 1 students will be exploring more Julia Donaldson stories which include Room on the Broom and A Squash and a Squeeze.

Year 2 students have been enjoying Nick Bland books such as The Very Super Bear and will continue to explore more Nick Bland stories including The Unscary Book and When Harry Caught Imaginitis.

Year 3 students are off to a great start exploring Graeme Base books which include Animalia, The Watering Hole and Uno's Garden.

Year 4 students have been introduced to author Jeanie Baker and will explore Jeanie Baker books which include Belonging and Circle.

Year 5 students our exploring Shaun Tan books which include Rules of Summer and Red Tree.

Year 6 students have enjoyed learning about author Paul Jennings and are beginning to explore his books which include Unbelievable and Gizmo. This term, students of all year levels are building their skills in making text to self, text to text and text to world connections.

Our library is a space where students not only attend scheduled library sessions, students also have an opportunity to visit our library on Mondays and Thursdays during lunch time. They can browse through and borrow a book from a huge selection of genres or they can spend some time reading a book of their choice in a calm, quiet and relaxing environment. We encourage all students to visit our lunch time library club.
