



Bullying. No Way! Week 2025

"Be bold. Be Kind. Speak up"

Bullying No Way Week is returning 11–15 August 2025. It is a national initiative that promotes kindness, inclusion, and respectful relationships. This important week empowers students to take action and helps build a school culture where everyone feels safe and supported.

The theme for this year is: "Be bold. Be kind. Speak up."

This message encourages students to take brave and compassionate steps to stand up for themselves and others — to show kindness, challenge disrespect, and seek help when needed.

At Gaayip-Yagila Primary School, students will be involved in a range of class-based activities and discussions aimed at:

- ·Recognising what bullying is and what it isn't
- ·Understanding how to respond safely and respectfully
- ·Promoting kindness and inclusion across our school
- ·Identifying trusted adults to speak to when help is needed

Our school is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all students. Families are encouraged to have conversations at home to reinforce the week's key messages: be courageous, act with kindness, and always speak up when something doesn't feel right.

Bullying No Way has produced a handy fact sheet that defines key terms and outline characteristics related to bullying. We encourage families to review the fact sheet around what bullying is and what it is not. Together, we can make Gaayip-Yagila Primary School a place where every student feels safe, seen, and supported — every day.



Definitions of bullying, harassment, discrimination and violence

Bullying, harassment, discrimination and violence are all interpersonal behaviours that can create or contribute to negative social environments. All school communities should have clear definitions outlined in their school policies and procedures for bullying, harassment, discrimination and violence.

Bullying

The national definition of bullying for Australian schools says: Bullying is an ongoing

and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through

repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders. Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

Behaviours that do not constitute bullying include:

- mutual arguments and disagreements (where there is no power imbalance)
- not liking someone or a single act of social rejection
- one-off acts of meanness or spite
- isolated incidents of aggression, intimidation or violence.

However, these conflicts still need to be addressed and resolved.

Likewise not all online issues are bullying. (Online bullying is sometimes referred to as cyberbullying and refers to bullying that is carried out through information and communication technologies.)

Harassment

Harassmentis behaviour that targets an individual or group due to their:

- identity, race, culture or ethnic origin
- \boxtimes religion
- \boxtimes physical characteristics
- \boxtimes aender
- sexual orientation
- \boxtimes marital, parenting or economic status
- \boxtimes
- ability or disability.

It offends, humiliates, intimidates or creates a hostile environment. It may be:

- an ongoing pattern of behaviour or a single act
- X directed randomly or towards the same person(s)
- intentional orunintentional.

Discrimination

Discrimination occurs when people are treated less favourably than others because of their:


- identity, race, culture or ethnic origin
- religion
- X physical characteristics
- gender
- sexual orientation
- marital, parenting or economic status
- ability or disability.

Violence

Violence is the intentional use of physical force or power, threatened or actual, against another person(s) that results in psychological harm, injury or in some cases death. It may involve provoked or unprovoked acts and can be a single incident, a random act or can occur over time.

Road Safety around Schools

Speed zones, pedestrian crossings and parking restrictions around school are there to improve the movement of traffic during peak times and maximise safety for children and road users. During the Summer holiday period our school crossing on Blackmore Road received an upgrade. The school crossing is now raised and aims to slow cars travelling along Blackmore Road.

It is vital as adults, we lead by example and set good road safety practices travelling to and from school. As such, we are asking all parents and carers to observe and obey parking signs.

Hume City Council have asked us to remind our school community that it is an offence to:

- double park by stopping next to a legally parked vehicle, even for a short time or to drop off /pick up passengers
- stop or park on the centre median strip (Blackmore Road
- stop or park across a driveway or footpath (especially down our side streets this has been occurring)
- stop or park within 10 metres of an intersection or corner that doesn't have traffic lights
- stop or park across or in a bus zone.

Council Local Laws Officers will be active around our school area to issue warnings and fines.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment that all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the skills students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing against national proficiency standards.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school's overall assessment and reporting process. It does not replace the ongoing assessments teachers make every day, but it does provide additional information about each child's learning progress. The results also give schools valuable insights into how educational programs are working.

We are pleased to share that our school's NAPLAN results this year have been positive, showing strong growth across year levels. We have also seen an increase in the number of students achieving results in the Strong or Exceeding categories. These results reflect and reinforce the changes we have made to our teaching and learning model, with a focus on explicit teaching to support every child's success.

We are proud of our students' efforts and achievements, and we thank our teachers and families for the important role they play in supporting learning every day.




PE NEWSLETTER

Auslan Moments Captured




Friendly Reminder: My Island Home performed during assembly, Monday the 11th.
