

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

Welcome to Term 2, Week 8. We are nearing the final weeks of our school term, and it's been a fantastic and busy time of learning and community connection.

This term, we have had the pleasure of welcoming educators from schools across Victoria who visited to observe our teaching practice in action. These visits focused on our implementation of Explicit Teaching, aligned with the Victorian Teaching and Learning Model (VTLM 2.0). It was a great opportunity to highlight the outstanding work of our staff and the strength of our teaching approach—characterised by clear instruction, consistent routines, and a strong focus on student support.

Swimming is a vital life skill, particularly in Australia where beaches, rivers, and pools are a big part of our lifestyle—ensuring children are safe and capable around water is essential. Our Year 3 and Year 4 students recently completed their week-long intensive swimming program. The program focused on building water confidence, developing key swimming skills, and learning about water safety. We saw enormous growth in the students' confidence levels – well done to all involved! Students in Foundation to Year 2 are scheduled to participate in their swimming program later this year.

Although we are just approaching the middle of the year, we are already planning for 2026! Children who turn five years old before April 30th, 2026, are eligible to start school next year. Thank you to those families who have already returned enrolment forms. If you have a child ready to start Foundation in 2026 and have not yet submitted your form, please come to the administration office before the end of term to collect one. In line with the Department of Education's Placement Policy and timeline, we will notify families of Foundation placement outcomes in early August.

A reminder that our whole school assembly will be held on Monday 16th June 2025, and we warmly encourage families to attend. Assemblies are a wonderful opportunity to celebrate student achievements, connect as a community, and share important updates.

Sharing of Annual Report to the School Community

The Annual Report provides an important opportunity for the Principal and School Council to share Gaayip-Yagila Primary School's achievements and progress with our community. Our 2024 Annual Report has now been endorsed by School Council, fully attested, and has successfully passed the Department's quality assurance process.

To parents/carers: Update on suspension and expulsion powers

Our school is committed to providing a safe, respectful and inclusive environment for all students and staff. You may be aware of recent changes announced to suspension and expulsion powers that will be available to Victorian principals from day one of Term 3, (Monday 21 July 2025).

We know that students' behaviour outside of school, particularly online, can sometimes impact the safety of students and staff at school.

In exceptional circumstances, principals of Victorian government schools will be able suspend or expel students for behaviour that occurs **outside of school grounds and/or hours including online**, if it poses a **significant danger to the safety and wellbeing of students or staff.**

These powers apply **only to serious incidents** where there is a clear and close connection to the school and the behaviour of a student outside of school unreasonably impacts the safety and wellbeing of students or staff at school, and their ability to learn or work. Please note:

- They do not apply to behaviours unrelated to the school or school community.
- They only apply to behaviour which occurs from Monday 21 July 2025 onwards

Suspension and expulsion will remain measures of last resort – our primary approach continues to **focus on proactive and positive behaviour support**, including working with you to teach students the behaviours we expect of them, in school and in life.

Thank you for your continued support as we work in partnership to educate and support our young people.

Students will be tasked with:

- A virtual kit with fun and challenging coding tasks
- Solve real world problems through coding, some maths and algorithmic thinking
- Learn and explore at their own pace, with scaffolding and resources



GYPS is once again having students participate in the Science Talent Search for 2025. This is run annually by the Science Teachers Association of Victoria. It is a wonderful opportunity for students to develop a broader understanding and application of Science and Technology- developing skills and attitudes which will contribute to the wellbeing and development of the wider community.
