

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

Welcome to Week 4 of Term 6! As we enter the final stretch of the school year, it is wonderful to reflect on the enriching experiences our students have had during the past fortnight. I would like to thank the staff and our supportive parent volunteers who assisted in making the following activities possible for our students.

Our Foundation students had a fantastic time on their first excursion to Animal Land in Digger's Rest. This outing was their first big adventure beyond school grounds, and it was positive to see their excitement and curiosity in learning about animals and farm life.

Our Year 1 and 2 students hosted their Grandparents Morning, creating an opportunity for families to come together and share stories across generations. Students were fascinated to learn from their grandparents, exploring the differences between life "back then" and now, and it was a special day of connection and discovery for everyone.

The Year 5 excursion to Quantum was a highlight, engaging students in robotics and hands-on learning that sparked their curiosity and creativity. These experiences in technology continue to inspire our students to think innovatively.

Finally, our Year 6 students led the way during their Discovery Week, showcasing their leadership skills as they facilitated multi-age activities for our younger students at the beginning of the week. They also took part in technology sessions at Quantum and visited the MCG, a memorable and enriching experience as they look toward the end of their primary school journey. Students completed the week with a Year 7 readiness session at Mickleham Secondary.

The process of Student Leadership selection for 2025 is well underway. Staff are now finalising the selection for each of the leadership positions. This is an exciting time for all those Year 3 to Year 5 students who have applied. We are thrilled with the number of students who have shown aspiration by putting their hand up to be considered. I wish them all the best for the process.

Last week, Katrina Lamers and I attended the HUME Principal Forum for Term 4, where we delved into the revised Victorian Teaching and Learning Model (VTLM 2.0) and gained insights into the Department of Education's renewed approach to the teaching of reading. Since the beginning of 2024, Gaayip-Yagila Primary School has been proactive in enhancing our teaching and learning approach toward reading and mathematics, with an increased emphasis on Phonics and Explicit Instruction. These improvements closely align with the Department of Education's new recommended practices and position us well for the changes we are expected to implement over the next three years.

SCHOOL SAVING BONUS

Parent and carer School Saving Bonus distribution

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus – a one-off \$400 support for government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

From Tuesday 26 November 2024, you will receive an email from the Department of Education with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code.

The School Saving Bonus will help families cover the cost of uniforms, textbooks, excursions, activities and more.

If you have multiple children enrolled in Victorian government schools for 2025, you will receive one School Saving Bonus code email per child. These emails might arrive on different days. Please make sure to check your spam/junk email folder.

Parents and carers can use the School Saving Bonus code in store at school-nominated suppliers. Parents and carers can also choose to access the School Saving Bonus online system, where they can allocate part or all the \$400 bonus to use at school nominated-online suppliers or for school activities.




Class Creation 2025



MHiPS (Mental Health in Primary Schools) - Canine Comprehension

Through the Department of Education's Mental Health Fund, GYPS has been running a four-week Canine Comprehension Dog Therapy program. This program focuses on friendship, responsibility, and communication skills, providing students with the opportunity to connect with George, a gentle six-year-old Spoodle.

Under the guidance of Judy, George's handler, our small group of selected Year 4–6 students have been working to build relationships, engage with targeted learning activities, and explore mindfulness resources. Students have thoroughly enjoyed their time with George and each other, building both social and emotional skills while also learning valuable lessons in caring for a dog. We are excited to welcome our selected group of Year 3 students, who will begin their own four-week program this Thursday!




