

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Initiative

Gaayip-Yagila Primary School has a strong commitment to creating positive, safe and supportive learning environments through empowering our students to become connected, engaged and collaborative learners.

The school has worked strategically to implement strong foundational structures, such as our matrix, and now we are excited to announce that we have been successful in applying to join the SWPBS initiative in 2024. Our school will have a dedicated coach and a school team focused on implementing research driven, consistent practices.

SWPBS is a framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe and supportive learning cultures. It assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for young people. When SWPBS is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. Students and staff benefit from:

- Increased respectful and positive behaviour
- Increased time focused on instruction
- Improved social-emotional wellbeing
- Positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- Increased adoption of evidence-based instructional practices
- A predictable learning environment with improved perceptions of safety and increased attendance

We look forward to updating you regularly next year as we progress with our important work.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT WELLBEING UPDATE

Harvard Data Wise

This year the Wellbeing Team had the opportunity to complete the Harvard Data Wise professional learning. This included 5 days training, online course material and then ongoing coaching at school. Some of the highlight achievements have been:

- Creating a student survey for our Year F-3 students to compliment the Year 4-6 AtoSS survey from DET
- Analysing the data in an informed manner focusing on reliability and validity
- Identifying key areas for improvement
- Creating an Action Plan to implement in 2024 focusing on inclusion

NDIS Funded Therapists for 2024



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

I authorise the Victorian Department of Education (DE) to use Centrelink Confirmation eServices to perform an enquiry about my Centrelink customer de and concession card status to enable the business to determine if I qualify for a concession, rebate or service. I also authorise the Victorian Department Families, Fairness and Housing (DFFH) to provide the results of any enquiry to DE regarding temporary care orders.

I understand that:

- DFFH or Centrelink will use information I have provided to DE to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DE personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- This consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DFFH and provide it to my child's school so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
- If I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DE.
- Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to DFFH and/or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.
- You can request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school
