




Australian South Sea Islanders National Recognition Day

This week we acknowledge Australian South Sea Islanders National Recognition Day, which is held on 25 August each year. The day recognises the history, heritage, and contributions of Australian South Sea Islanders, who are descendants of the men, women, and children brought to Australia—often under harsh conditions—from more than 80 Pacific Islands.

It is an important opportunity for us to reflect on the resilience and strength of the Australian South Sea Islander community, to acknowledge their significant contributions to our country, and to deepen our understanding of their unique cultural identity.

At Gaayip-Yagila Primary School, we value and celebrate the many cultures that make up our community, and this day is another way we continue to learn from and honour the diverse histories and traditions that shape us.

The official Australian South Sea Islander flag was initially designed in consultation with the ASSI community and executive of the then Australian South Sea Islanders United Council (ASSIUC) in 1994.

Road Safety around Schools

Speed zones, pedestrian crossings and parking restrictions around school are there to improve the movement of traffic during peak times and maximise safety for children and road users. During the Summer holiday period our school crossing on Blackmore Road received an upgrade. The school crossing is now raised and aims to slow cars travelling along Blackmore Road.

It is vital as adults, we lead by example and set good road safety practices travelling to and from school. As such, we are asking all parents and carers to observe and obey parking signs.

Hume City Council have asked us to remind our school community that it is an offence to:

- double park by stopping next to a legally parked vehicle, even for a short time or to drop off /pick up passengers
- stop or park on the centre median strip (Blackmore Road
- stop or park across a driveway or footpath (especially down our side streets this has been occurring)
- stop or park within 10 metres of an intersection or corner that doesn't have traffic lights
- stop or park across or in a bus zone.

Council Local Laws Officers will be active around our school area to issue warnings and fines.

What's Nude Food? It's food packed without wrappers — no plastic, foil, or paper. Bring lunch and snacks in reusable containers to help keep our school clean and green!



VICTORIA CONTAINER SCHEME





Great news — our Victoria container recycling program is going really well! So far, we've collected enough containers to earn \$185.00. If we keep this pace going, we estimate we can raise another **\$200 by the end of the term!**

We are filling our donation bags quite fast but can always use more donations. We are gathering approximately **100 to 150 containers**, every few days across the whole school. That's a huge achievement, so thank you to everyone who's been placing their 10 cent containers in their grey CDS buckets in their classroom.

A few reminders to keep things running smoothly:

Some buckets may need a clean — sometimes juice and milk containers are being put in without being fully emptied. Please remember to drink all your drinks before recycling!

Buckets should be returned to their own classrooms — we'll be reminding a few classes to make sure this happens.

With everyone's help, our goal is within reach. By the end of **Semester 2** (**Term 3 and 4**), we'll likely have achieved **30-40% of our target** — amazing work!

Biodiversity Audit



Our school recently completed a biodiversity audit and earned a score of **66** — such an amazing achievement for our first time! With around **2,000 to 3,000 plants** in our garden, we're already making a big difference for birds, bugs, and other wildlife. ** It's exciting to see how much life our garden supports!

But we're not stopping there. We're now aiming for a score of **70% or more in 2026**, and we know what steps we need to take to get even better.

Things we'll improve:

- Add more native canopy trees to provide shade, shelter, and homes for animals.
- **Place more logs and rocks** so creatures like insects and lizards have safe places to live and hide.
- Create bird boxes so we can attract more native and local birds to our school.
- Build some bug hotels so we can encourage more insect life at our school.

By making these small changes, our garden will become an even better home for nature. We're excited to work together to care for our plants, protect wildlife, and keep learning about biodiversity.

Let's keep growing, exploring, and making our school greener, wilder, and even more awesome — for all living things! ♥ Every leaf, twig, and creature counts!

SCIENCE



Welcome to week 5 of term3in Science. This term the students have been learning about Physical Science. Foundation has been learning about rolling and the objects that can roll in our everyday lives. Year 1 has been learning about forces specifically pushing and pulling. Year 2 has been learning about sound and will be applying this information in making instruments out of everyday materials. Year 3 has been learning about heat and how we keep warm through different methods. Year 4 has been learning about all the different types of forces that work around us, including gravitational, magnetism, and electrical forces. They have also been learning about how forces can be contact and non-contact. Year 5 has been learning about light and the different forms of light including natural and man-made. Year 6 have been learning about electricity, including how to be safe with using electrical items, how electrical circuits work and building an electric circuit.

Upcoming Events

On the 11th, 12th and 15th of September there is an excursion to Quantum for our Year 5 students. The students will be looking at LEGO Robotics and how these building blocks can be used to explore physical science in a fun and individual way. Please check XUNO for payment details.

• Visual Arts Term 3

This term...

...we've wrapped up our mask making unit, and have begun learning about self-portraits. Students have been learning about the history of self-portraits, and examining the work of artists such as Kaylene Whiskey, Sid Pattni, Frida Kahlo and Abdul Abdullah.


Students have learned about proportion and practiced creating their own self-portraits and have experimented with a range of materials and techniques. Foundation students have been practicing drawing at a large scale, and creating background for their self-portraits using a variety of materials and pattern making. Year 1/2s have been focusing on proportion and experimenting with soft pastels, practicing blending and layering to create different skin and hair tones. Year 3/4s have been learning about staging and taking photographic self-portraits, then creating their own carbon paper to trace their photographs onto paper and colouring them in with watercolour pencils. The Year 5/6s are creating acetate self-portraits inspired by Sid Pattni's faceless self-portrait, tracing their own photographic self-portraits onto acetate, then painting the reverse of the acetate to add colour and detail.

We're so excited to be able to share the students work with you all, with our GYPS Art Show Masks and Mirrors opening on the Monday, October 13th from 4pm to 6pm in the Gymnasium. The gallery will then be open from 3:15pm to 4pm from Tuesday 14th to Thursday 16th of October for families and the GYPS community to come and experience. We hope to see you all there!
