

Please be advised that nominations for parent representatives on our School Council will be distributed during the week commencing February 26th through Xuno. Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

The Department administers the CSEF to help eligible families with the costs of camps, sporting activities and excursions. Payments for 2024 are \$125 per year for eligible primary school students. The payments is made directly to an eligible student's school. Applications are to be received by the school no later than 28 June 2024.

Some common examples of school-organised programs for which a CSEF payment may be used include:

- school camps/trips
- swimming and other school-organised sporting programs
- outdoor education programs
- excursions/incursions.

Eligibility for the CSEF

·Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. A special consideration category also exists. Schools can receive applications from families by 28 June 2024.

·Families can list more than one student in the one application form if they are attending the same school.

Submitting an application

A parent/carer will only be required to submit an application form to the school in the following circumstances:

- the parent/carer is applying for the CSEF payment for the first time i.e. an application form was not lodged with the school in the previous year, or
- circumstances have changed for example, there has been a change in the care arrangement of the student, a change of name or CRN, or a new sibling has started at the school and the parent/carer wishes to apply for the CSEF payment for the new sibling also.

Road Safety around Schools

As a reminder, please prioritise road safety when dropping off or picking up your children. We kindly ask that you use the designated school crossing to cross the road, rather than crossing along Blackmore Road. Your cooperation ensures the safety of everyone in our community. Thank you for your attention to this important matter.

If you have concerns regarding road safety this can be raised with the Hume Council Local Laws Office.

Collecting Students during school hours

As a school we are committed to child safety. The following processes are in place for early collection of students.

Students are to be signed out at the office by a parent/guardian. If the student is being collected by someone other than the parent/guardian, we require the parent/guardian to call the office prior to collection to authorise on each occasion.

Verification of identity using suitable photo identification (such as a driver's licence or passport) must be sighted by school personnel for every collection.

Tip: Take a photo of your licence on your phone for easy access.



Student Toilets

We understand the importance of maintaining a clean and hygienic environment for our students, and we want to address any concerns you may have regarding the cleanliness of the student toilets. Our cleaning staff work diligently to ensure that these facilities are cleaned each night to uphold high standards of hygiene. Throughout the school day toilets are checked and cleaning undertaken as required.

To further support cleanliness and hygiene, we kindly ask parents to encourage proper use of the toilets by their children. By working together, we can help maintain a clean and comfortable environment for all.

MOBILE PHONE POLICY

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours. Smart Watches are also included in this ban.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause.

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

Further information

Exceptions: For a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may be granted. Please contact Nurse Daniella if you would like to discuss this.

Emergencies: In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT CURRICULUM UPDATE

TEACHING READING

Last year one of our newsletter articles discussed the important key components of reading known as the 'Big Six in Reading'. While our teachers explicitly teach all six components of the 'Big Six', this year we are excited to share with you that we are focusing on the way we teach Phonemic Awareness.

WHAT IS PHONEMIC AWARENESS?

Phonemic awareness is the ability to recognize and manipulate individual sounds (phonemes) in spoken words. It is a foundational skill crucial for early literacy and plays a pivotal role in a child's journey toward becoming a proficient reader. Research consistently shows that children who develop strong phonemic awareness skills are better equipped to tackle the challenges of reading and spelling.

HEGGERTY

To enhance our explicit teaching of phonemic awareness, we are in the early stages of introducing the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Program. This research-based and teacher-friendly program is designed to help educators systematically and effectively teach phonemic awareness skills to learners.

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Recognizing the importance of providing your child with the best possible educational experience, we are committed to ensuring our teaching staff is well-equipped to implement the Heggerty program successfully. To achieve this, our educators are currently undergoing professional learning sessions to deepen their understanding of phonemic awareness and learn effective strategies for incorporating the Heggerty program into their daily instruction.

WHY PHONEMIC AWARENESS MATTERS

Phonemic awareness serves as the foundation for reading and writing. These skills are important for children through all stages of learning in Primary School. By honing these skills, children can:

- Decode words more efficiently
- Improve their spelling and writing abilities
- Develop a stronger vocabulary

HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT AT HOME

If you would like to support your child to develop their phonemic awareness at home here are a few simple ways you can support your child's phonemic awareness development:

Read Aloud: Regularly read stories together, emphasizing sounds in words. Rhyme Time: Engage in rhyming games or activities to highlight sound patterns. Sound Play: Encourage your child to identify individual sounds in spoken words.

AUSLAN

Guess what? We're adding Auslan (Australian Sign Language) to our school curriculum! Auslan is sign language used by many of our deaf community in Australia.

Did you know that there are two dialects?

One is the northern dialect used in Queensland and New South Wales. The other is the one that we will be learning called the southern dialect which is used in Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia and Western Australia.

Learning Auslan will be an amazing opportunity for our students! It means that they can communicate with the Deaf community and gain insight into its rich cultural heritage. There will also be a focus on assisting students to understand and respect others, appreciate differences, and be open to new ideas.

Exciting news! We'll be sharing some important signs in every newsletter so everyone in our school community can learn Auslan together! This week three of our incredible G.Y.P.S. students will be teaching us the signs for hello/goodbye, yes and no. Next fortnight we will be focusing on letters and practising our name.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

I authorise the Victorian Department of Education (DE) to use Centrelink Confirmation eServices to perform an enquiry about my Centrelink customer de and concession card status to enable the business to determine if I qualify for a concession, rebate or service. I also authorise the Victorian Department Families, Fairness and Housing (DFFH) to provide the results of any enquiry to DE regarding temporary care orders.

I understand that:

- DFFH or Centrelink will use information I have provided to DE to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DE personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- This consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DFFH and provide it to my child's school so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
- If I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DE.
- Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to DFFH and/or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.
- You can request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school
