

Together, we continue to uphold the spirit of ANZAC and ensure that their legacy lives on. Lest we forget.




Introducing "Star of the Week"





ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT CURRICULUM UPDATE

MATHEMATICS CURRICULUM CHANGES 2024

As part of our commitment to providing the best possible education for your children, we are implementing the revised Mathematics Curriculum 2.0, recently published by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA).

The decision to adopt Mathematics Curriculum 2.0 stems from our dedication to continuously improving the quality of education we offer. We believe that this updated curriculum will better equip our students with the skills and knowledge necessary for success in mathematics and beyond. Additionally, aligning with this new curriculum allows us to synchronize our teaching approach with our newly adopted Explicit Direct Instruction model.

Starting in 2024, all schools are required to implement the revised curriculum, with the option to do so in either 2024 or 2025. At Gaayip-Yagila Primary School, we have chosen to embrace this change in 2024 to ensure that our students benefit from the enhanced learning opportunities as soon as possible. This change over year will allow us to teach content that students may have missed in previous years, or content that has been moved between year levels.


One significant aspect of this transition is how student progress is reported. Previously, our teachers reported against the three strands of the achievement standard for mathematics: Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, and Statistics and Probability. However, under Mathematics Curriculum 2.0, teachers will report against the achievement standard as a whole, providing a single, aggregated score.

This means that the first time you receive a report under the Mathematics 2.0 curriculum, it will only show achievement and not progress. Subsequent reports will include progress assessments against the single achievement standard, allowing you to track your child's development over time more comprehensively.

We understand that change can sometimes be challenging, but we are confident that this transition will ultimately benefit our students by ensuring they receive the highest quality mathematics education possible. As always, we are here to support you and your child throughout this process.

We will provide further communication regarding this change when reports are released to families at the end of the term. If you have any questions or concerns regarding the implementation of Mathematics Curriculum 2.0, please do not hesitate to reach out to us.

AUSLAN NEWS

As we step into a new term, we are thrilled to announce the continuation of our Auslan (Australian Sign Language) program with great enthusiasm. Last term, our students explored the foundations of Auslan through the alphabet, colors, and everyday signs. This term promises to be equally exciting as we delve deeper into the rich language and culture of the Deaf community.

Throughout the coming weeks, we are committed to providing our students with opportunities to expand their signing skills. Building upon the groundwork laid last term, our students will revisit familiar signs and concepts to help solidify their understanding and fluency in Auslan.

But that's not all – this term, our students in grades 1- 4 are set to take their learning to new heights with engaging hands-on activities that are designed to support they exploration of signs related to school, numbers and the farm. Meanwhile, our students in grades 5 and 6 will focus on refining their handshape formation and describing these topics in greater detail. Our Foundation students will participate in activities tailored to further develop their understanding of the Auslan alphabet. These themes not only expand our students' vocabulary but also deepen their comprehension of Auslan's application in various contexts.

Whether they are signing about familiar places and people in our school community, mastering counting in Auslan, or learning the signs for beloved farm animals, our students are sure to enjoy the journey of discovery.

We are truly excited for the term ahead and the progress our students will make on their Auslan journey. By nurturing a positive and inclusive learning environment, we strive to empower all students to communicate confidently and respectfully, both within our school community and beyond.

We would like to extend our gratitude to the entire school community for your ongoing support of our Auslan program.
