

CURRICULUM UPDATE

Parent Teacher Interviews - Wednesday 10th September

Our upcoming Parent Teacher Interviews are an important opportunity for you to meet with your child's teachers. These meetings are designed so families can:

- meet and get to know teachers
- build a positive relationship with the school
- share information about your child's interests and learning
- talk more in-depth about your child's student reports

Parent-teacher interviews are a valuable way to strengthen the connection between home and school. They give teachers the chance to better understand your child, while also helping you learn how you can support your child's learning at home.

Parent Teacher Interviews will be held on Wednesday September 10th. Please book your meeting now on Xuno. If you require support to make your booking, please contact the school office.

Each interview is limited to 10 minutes. To ensure fairness for all families, teachers cannot run over time. If you would like to discuss further matters at the end of your meeting, please arrange another appointment at a later date.

CURRICULUM UPDATE CONT....

During the interview, teachers will:

- provide information about your child's academic performance
- discuss areas in which your child excels and areas requiring support
- share insights into how your child interacts with their peers in the school setting
- offer suggestions on how you can best support your child at home

Teachers will also answer any questions you may have about your child's progress and wellbeing at school.

How to prepare for your interview:

- Read through your child's semester and ongoing reports and note topics you'd like to discuss
- Write down any questions you'd like to ask the teacher
- Ask your child if they have questions they would like you to raise, or information they'd like you to share
- Think about any recent changes or experiences that may have impacted your child that would be helpful for the teacher to know.

We look forward to seeing you and working together to support your child's learning journey.







Student Arrivals

As we continue to strive for excellence in education, I would like to remind everyone of the importance of punctuality in our daily school routine.

Classrooms open at 8:50am, and it is crucial that all students are in class and ready for learning by 9.00am. This ensures that they can fully benefit from the day's lessons and activities. Repeated lateness has a well-documented negative impact on student learning and the overall effectiveness of our school programs. It disrupts not only the late student but also their classmates and teachers.

We understand that mornings can be challenging, but we ask for your cooperation in ensuring that all students arrive on time. Your support in this matter is greatly appreciated and will contribute significantly to the success of our students and the smooth operation of our school.

Over the past 2 weeks 29% of students were late to school at least once during this time. 5% of students were late at least 5 days over the 2 week period. In the afternoons, we have also had 20% of students leave early on at least one occasion.

Sun Smart - Hats

We are committed to protecting our students from harmful UV exposure. ALL students must wear a broad-brimmed school hat when UV levels are 3 or higher. In Victoria, this typically applies from mid to late August through to the end of April (Term 2).

From Monday 8th September 2025, students will be required to wear their school hat whenever they are outside. Students without a hat will be asked to sit in the designated undercover area during recess and lunch.

Hats can be purchased through our uniform supplier, Academy Uniforms. We strongly encourage families to ensure each hat is clearly named, so it can be returned if misplaced.

It is a reminder that we do not need to be experts to help - just a good friend and a good listener.


Together, we can help create a culture where people feel connected and supported, every day of the year.

Road Safety around Schools

Speed zones, pedestrian crossings and parking restrictions around school are there to improve the movement of traffic during peak times and maximise safety for children and road users. During the Summer holiday period our school crossing on Blackmore Road received an upgrade. The school crossing is now raised and aims to slow cars travelling along Blackmore Road.

It is vital as adults, we lead by example and set good road safety practices travelling to and from school. As such, we are asking all parents and carers to observe and obey parking signs.

Hume City Council have asked us to remind our school community that it is an offence to:

- double park by stopping next to a legally parked vehicle, even for a short time or to drop off /pick up passengers
- stop or park on the centre median strip (Blackmore Road
- stop or park across a driveway or footpath (especially down our side streets this has been occurring)
- stop or park within 10 metres of an intersection or corner that doesn't have traffic lights
- stop or park across or in a bus zone.

Council Local Laws Officers will be active around our school area to issue warnings and fines.






AUSLAN NEWS

National Week of Deaf People (NWDP) is a week long celebration of Deaf individuals and the Australian Deaf community. It includes celebrating the International Day of Deaf people and the International Day of Sign Languages. It is on the 22-28th of September.

What's been happening in Auslan?



Our Foundation students have been learning the letters of the Auslan alphabet. For each letter, they've been exploring numbers, colours, and an animal beginning with that letter. This hands-on approach is helping them connect their knowledge in fun and memorable ways.

In Years 1–2, students have been diving into storytelling and fairytales. They've enjoyed learning to retell stories in Auslan, exploring how to use facial expressions, role shift, and handshapes to bring their characters to life.

Years 3–6 have been developing their storytelling skills through comic strips. Students are designing and creating their own Auslan comic stories, combining drawing and signing to structure their narratives in creative ways.

We are so proud of all our students for their enthusiasm and dedication to learning Auslan. Keep an eye out for updates as we continue to develop our skills and deepen our understanding of this beautiful language.
