

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families, Welcome to Term 2 Week 7.

Last week we welcomed **Con Corso** to Gaayip-Yagila Primary School as the Assistant Principal responsible for Daily Operations, Facilities, OHS and Policy. Con was previously a Leading Teacher at Roxburgh Rise Primary School.

The Capital Works project is continuing to progress. Four companies have attended onsite to review the building area in readiness to prepare a tender for the works. The tender process is being conducted and assessed by VSBA and they will advise of the outcome in mid-August. We have been advised that during the upcoming school holidays some of our buildings will be relocated in readiness for the building works to begin.

Yesterday we had Day 2 of our School Review. Members of the review team conducted observations of classroom, team planning, the leadership meeting and staff professional learning. They also completed focus group conversations with staff and students. School wide documentation was also reviewed throughout the day. Next week there will be further observations and discussions, including the parent focus group. We encourage families who would like to share their views to sign up for to focus group. We have scheduled the focus groups for Thursday 15th June at 9.00am. If you are interested in being a part of the focus group please sign up here.

2024 ENROLMENT INFORMATION

Enrolments are being accepted for 2024. A Statewide timeline for enrolling in Foundation for the 2024 school year has been established, with guidelines around dates being mandated. Therefore, if you have a child starting primary school in 2024, it is time to enrol. Every application must be submitted before Friday 28th July 2023. If you currently have a child attending Gaayip-Yagila Primary School and a new sibling beginning in 2024, your child will be prioritised at our school as per the Department's Placement Policy. We encourage you to contact the school administration office at your earliest convenience to complete an enrolment form (you will require your child's birth certificate or passport and their Medicare Immunisation Certificate).

Our school tours run each fortnight and places are limited. If you know of families who are considering enrolling their child into Foundation at Gaayip-Yagila Primary School next year, please direct them to the enrolment page on our website or have them contact our administration team.

CURRICULUM REPORT

MATHS GAMES

The best approach to the teaching of mathematics continues to evolve rapidly. One way to support student learning in mathematics is by involving them in playing games to practice numeracy skills. Some of the ways this approach supports mathematical development in students are:

- Reinforcing Fundamental Skills: Math games provide an enjoyable way for children to reinforce fundamental mathematical skills. Games often involve counting, number recognition, basic operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division), and problem-solving. By playing these games, students can solidify their understanding of these concepts while having a blast!
- Building Number Sense: Number sense is the ability to understand and work with numbers flexibly. Games can help children develop a strong number sense by encouraging estimation, mental math, and strategic thinking. Whether it's calculating points, making quick decisions, or determining the best move, games sharpen students' numerical intuition.
- Enhancing Critical Thinking: Mathematical games are excellent for developing critical thinking skills. They require children to analyze problems, devise strategies, and make decisions based on logical reasoning. Games like puzzles, Sudoku, or strategy-based board games promote problemsolving abilities and improve analytical thinking.
- Promoting Collaboration and Communication: Many math games are designed to be played in pairs or groups, fostering collaboration and communication among students. Working together to solve problems, explain strategies, and discuss different approaches enhances their understanding of mathematical concepts. Furthermore, these cooperative activities cultivate teamwork and empathy.
- Applying Math to Real-World Situations: Playing math-related games allows students to see the practical applications of mathematical concepts. Games involving money, measurements, or geometry, for example, provide opportunities to apply math skills to real-life situations. This connection helps students appreciate the relevance of mathematics in their daily lives.

- Boosting Confidence and Motivation: Games offer a safe and enjoyable environment for children to practice math skills without fear of failure. As they experience success, their confidence grows, and they become more motivated to explore further. Games with different levels of difficulty allow students to challenge themselves and celebrate their progress.
- Engaging and Fun Learning Experience: Most importantly, math games provide a fun and engaging learning experience. When students are enjoying themselves, they are more likely to be actively involved and fully invested in the learning process. By infusing playfulness into mathematics, games create a positive attitude towards the subject and foster a love for learning.



CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

The Department administers the CSEF to help eligible families with the costs of camps, sporting activities and excursions. Payments for 2023 are \$125 per year for eligible primary school students. The payment is made directly to an eligible student's school. *Applications are to be received by the school no later than 23 June 2023*.

Some common examples of school-organised programs for which a CSEF payment may be used include:

- School camps/trips
- Swimming and other school-organised sporting programs
- Outdoor education programs
- Excursions/incursions.

Eligibility for the CSEF

- Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. A special consideration category also exists.
 Schools can receive applications from families by 23 June 2023.
- Families can list more than one student in the one application form if they are attending the same school.

Submitting an application

A parent/carer will only be required to submit an application form to the school in the following circumstances:

- The parent/carer is applying for the CSEF payment for the first time i.e. an application form was not lodged with the school in the previous year, or
- Circumstances have changed for example, there has been a change in the care arrangement of the student, a change of name or CRN, or a new sibling has started at the school and the parent/carer wishes to apply for the CSEF payment for the new sibling also.

It was also a whole lot of fun!




SCIENCE NEWS



On the 16th of June the Foundation students will have a Science Day which will include a Wicked Weather incursion. This will enable our students to learn even more about the weather. Additionally, they have now embarked on an exploration of Earth's abundant natural resources, discovering the wonders and importance of our







Year 1 and 2 students continue their captivating journey into the prehistoric era. After constructing their own dinosaur protective shields using various materials, they are now collaborating to create their own dinosaurs and building habitats to provide a glimpse into the prehistoric world. This hands-on approach sparks student's imagination and fosters teamwork skills.









Meanwhile, year 3 and 4 students have just concluded an engaging project centered around designing a new animal species that thrives in the remarkable Eucalyptus tree ecosystem. 
