

The Department of Education and Training developed a <u>policy</u> that describes the positive behaviour expected from parents, carers, and other adults in Victorian school communities. In the event an incident has occurred between children at school, we encourage you to firstly raise this with your child's classroom teacher.

Aggression and harassment of any kind—physical, verbal or otherwise (including written correspondence) — isn't acceptable.

2023 PARENT / CAREGIVER / GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY:

WE WANT OUR PARENTS / CAREGIVERS / GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional but we encourage all families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All families are invited to participate in the survey.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September 2023.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Survey results will be communicated to parents / caregivers / guardians through annual reporting processes. Further information will be sent out tomorrow via Xuno.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2024

As a result of the new timeline that has been introduced by the Department of Education, enrolments for 2024 are now due. If you have a child who will be starting Foundation next year it is important that you speak to our administration team this week to complete enrolment forms so that we can plan for anticipated enrolments. If you have a neighbour, friend or relative who lives within our designated neighbourhood (www.findmyschool.gov.au) we ask you to check that they have enrolled their child. If you have any questions, please speak with our administration team.

SUNSMART - HATS

Our school policy states that **ALL children MUST** wear a **school hat** when UV levels are 3 or higher. This is typically from mid to late August until the end of April in Term 2. Could you please ensure your child has their hat in their bag in readiness for later this term. We strongly encourage parents to provide students with a named school hat, so that it can be returned in the event that it may be lost. Students without a hat must sit undercover at recess and lunch. Currently, we are being advised that Sun protection is not recommended as the UV Index is predicted to reach 2 [Low]. We will continue to update parents each fortnight.


NATIONAL ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER CHILDREN'S DAY

In P.E. this term students have been learning skills in Gymnastics and in Basketball.

Foundation, Year 1 & 2 students have been learning balancing skills on the beam. They have learnt how to land in the correct motorbike pose when performing jumping activities off the beam. In Basketball they have been learning to dribble the ball by maintaining the skill of using their fingertips and keeping the ball at waist height and enjoying ball games





SCIENCE NEWS


Foundation students have been busy learning about movement and have had a blast participating in various fun movement activities. Everything from energetic games to thinking about the ways they move in the playground.



Students in Years 1 and 2 have been fascinated by the wonders of nature, specifically focusing on the changing seasons and the cycle of day and night. Through engaging activities and discussions, they have gained a deeper understanding of how nature transforms around them.


