

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families

It has been a busy couple of weeks here at Gaayip-Yagila Primary School. Students in Year 5 & 6 have commenced their swimming program and staff, students and volunteers have all spoken positively about these experiences. On Monday 14th August, selected Year 3 – 6 students were able to represent our school at District Athletics, congratulations to all who participated and a very big thank you to the parent volunteers who make it possible for us to run these events.

Student Attendance

We are excited to introduce a new process aimed at enhancing student attendance. Attending school regularly and arriving on time are essential components of academic success and personal growth. When students attend school consistently, they gain access to a structured learning environment that fosters social, emotional, and intellectual growth. Classrooms are where they engage in discussions, collaborate with peers, and learn from teachers who are dedicated to their progress.

Moreover, consistent attendance cultivates a strong work ethic and discipline, both of which are essential life skills. By attending school regularly, students are better prepared to handle the challenges they'll encounter in higher education and the workforce.

To further support our attendance strategies, we will make an adjustment in the way we communicate absences to families. This will begin on Monday 21st August. From this time, the school will use Xuno to send communication to the families of absent students.

This communication will inform families that the student is absent from school and will direct you to log into Xuno to report a reason for the absence. This communication will be sent as an email and as an internal message through Xuno by 10:00am each day. Please look out for these messages and respond as needed. We appreciate your support as we implement this new process. We will also continue with our existing processes of teachers making calls daily for unexplained absences.

This term, our teachers had professional learning on setting up the day in a positive, engaging and routine manner. From 8.50am-9.00am, our students complete a morning check in and set up expectations goals from our matrix. This is an important part of the day to build collaboration, excellence, respect and kindness.

Peer Mediators

Thank you to our AMAZING Peer Mediators from Years 4-6 who are offering support to students in the playground at recess and lunch break times. Our Peer Mediators have attended two training sessions where they developed their skills and understandings required to be a successful Peer Mediator. These included Active Listening, Demonstrating Empathy, Resolving Conflict and Understanding the Size of the Problem. The Peer Mediators walk around at break times in designated areas in brightly coloured vests – you can't miss them. They say hello to students, help them if they need to find a friend and sort out little

conflicts (e.g. turn taking). If a student comes to them needing support with a bigger problem the Peer Mediators will escort the students to a teacher. Our Peer Mediators have demonstrated Leadership and confidence in carrying out this role – fantastic skills to develop! This role all contributes to a positive school climate and our younger students love seeking out the support of these role models when needed. Well done Peer Mediators!

Students coming to Breakfast Club this term have been enjoying smoothies as our new menu item. SCIENCE NEWS

Foundation

Over the past weeks Our Foundation students have been looking how things move. We have been able to play with toys and identifying the different ways they move. Students have enjoyed the many activities such as moving their bodies in different ways and using real toys in hands on experiences to practice different kinds of movements.



Year One and Two

Learning about weather has been fun! Grades 1 and 2 have had the opportunity to learn about our four seasons. We have been focusing on what kind of weather happens during these seasons. Students have also had the opportunity to find out more about the Wurundjeri Seasons cycle. This week we have also learnt about man made and natural items and used a natural material from our

school grounds to create a natural scene.

Grade 3 and 4 have been learning about the Earth, Moon, and Sun. In the past few weeks, we have had the opportunity to investigate how our Earth, Moon and Sun move. We have created an Earth with playdoh demonstrating how the axis rotates the Earth and the Earth revolves around the Sun to create our four seasons.








Year 5 and 6



Hello children, families and school community,

Term Three has been a breeze!

Just like that, the children and TheirCare team have been blitzing our way through term 3. It has been another exciting yet challenging one, as we've continued to enhance our program transitioning different areas to best fit the children whilst building up our service compliance.

We would like to say a big thank you to all our families who've helped support the team, through feedback and ideas, as well as through words of support and encouragement for how the program has been set up to benefit each of the children. It has been an awesome term, as we've had new faces join our family as well as older ones who've rejoined, enhancing our program to "think outside of the box" as well as refining older skills and implementing them to.

The children have been able to create newer skills and strengthen older ones through a plethora of activities that have been set up. Homemade cooking experiences, STEM experiments and artisitic painting sessions have been some of the categories we've explored this term.

In addition, through group collaboration, feedback/suggestion sheets and observations, the children and educators have been able to create unique programs each week based upon our weekly themes including our explored themes, NAIDOC week, World Children's week and Sustainability week.

This week (6), the children have gotten mad within our mad scientist theme, "STEM Week". We've explored different experiments in regards to chemical reactions and have ensured that the children hypothesise their predictions on each experiment to educate them on creating theories. So far, we've watched the reactions between coke and mentos creating CoCa Cola rockets, witnessed water elevation within our capillary experiment and mixed ingredients to create a carbon snake. Finishing off the week, we will be looking at the law of attraction in our Charles candle experiement and create oobleck slime.

As we near the end of term 3, our Spring HP comes closer.




